## LAST CLASS DAY: Thursday, Friday - December $6^{\text {th }}, 7^{\text {th }}$

## DUE: Monday, Tuesday - December $10^{\text {th }}, 11^{\text {th }}$

OBJECTIVES: Students will collaborate to produce a triptych that depicts a narrative, a transformation, or three parts of a whole.

ART PRODUCTION: Each student will be responsible for creating a segment of their group's triptych. To unify the segments of your group's triptych, you must adhere to a selection of design principles and/or elements. Fundamentals such as repetition, color, pattern, or balance will help to visually join any stylistic variation within your triptych. Additionally, the segments of your triptych must be the same size and shape. Finally, you may choose your own theme-but the triptych must communicate a narrative, a transformation, or exist as three sections of a whole image.

To encourage a proper division of labor, each student will be graded individually upon their own segment of the triptych using the following criteria.
