Radial: Actual equilibrium from a certain point. All of the petals radiate from the center.




Asymmetrical: Creates equilibrium among parts that aren't similar.

Scale: The size of an object in relation to normal size. The people are small which can be seen by the rice in comparison.




The car seems small in comparison to the road and outside world, which is caused by distance.




Proportion: The size of an object in relation to other parts or the whole.

Emphasis: The stressing of a part of the work through color, value, and position.
