

### THE ACE RESPONSE

ACE Teaching Fellows forms talented, faith-filled college graduates—from nearly all undergraduate majors and more than 200 colleges and universities—to renew and transform Catholic school classrooms. Through ACE's innovative instructional model, ACE Teachers develop the skills and knowledge necessary to serve some of the most under-resourced schools in the United States.

Over the course of two summers and two academic years, ACE Teachers earn a cost-free Master of Education and eligibility for state licensure. The first summer session pairs a practicum experience with graduate coursework. The second brings teachers back to campus to build upon their first year experience. During the academic year, ACE Teachers serve as full-time instructional leaders and are enrolled in coursework designed to improve their practice.

The three pillars of ACE—forming professional educators, building community, and growing spiritually—inform, inspire, and mobilize ACE Teachers throughout their time in the program and beyond.
